Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Under supervision of Director, assists in enforcement of legislation related to environmental health programs and grants involving a variety of activities including inspections of food facilities, conducting preliminary and final inspections, investigating public health nuisances, public education and implementing disease control.

- Retail and Food Service operational inspections
 - Performs facility reviews prior to opening based on Code requirements
 - Performs routine and follow-up inspections at facilities
 - Provides consultations, education/information to operators on a regular basis
 - a. Works closely with operators to effect change in facilities to bring establishment into code compliance
 - Performs emergency inspections as required
 - Performs complaint driven onsite investigations, including necessary follow-up
 - Assists in Food-borne illness investigations
 - Performs inspections of Temporary Food Service Facilities including but not limited to Farmer's markets and community/food events

 - Performs preliminary and final inspections of private and semi-private water wells based on Code requirements.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

This position requires sitting (6-8 hrs), standing/walking (1-2hrs) and constant use of the hands and fingers for typing/keyboarding.
